Overview

This plan is part of a suite of policies that outline how the academy will respond to a significant Covid 19 outbreak either at a local academy level or a local area

There are three parts to the contingency plan parts of this plan firstly, if there has to be a full or partial closure of the academy due to academy level infection.

Secondly, if our local area sees a spike in coronavirus infection rates resulting in localised community spread- which could include the partial closure of schools and academies in our area.

The third part is information that is response to all levels of contingency eg. communication

This document outlines how the academy will operate in these circumstances. The academy will work closely with the local health protection team (HPT) and implement provisions as advised by the team.

This is a live document that will be reviewed by the senior leadership team in conjunction with other key stakeholders as and when the situation develops.

The contingency framework- Local academy level

The contingency framework (Local academy level) is designed to act as a containment measure where:

- There is a high prevalence of coronavirus in the academy.
- There is a medium prevalence of coronavirus in the academy

Restrictive measures, of the kind set out in the contingency framework, cannot be implemented by academies without the explicit agreement of the DfE/ PHE. This plan sets out how the school will operate if additional restrictions become necessary.

Where advised by the PHE/DfE, in line with the available evidence, the school will only allow the on-site attendance of those pupils/ bubbles that are allowed.

Complete Closure

If the academy is directed to completely close, then remote teaching will take place but this will depend on the availability of staff that are available for work (see [Pupil Remote Learning Policy](#) on website).

Food Provision

This will depend on the nature of the closure but could involve FSM pupils receiving a voucher for a local supermarket.

Partial Closure

Existing policies would come into action especially the Pupil Remote Learning Policy.

Bubbles/ classes that are allowed to attend the academy will be in consultation with PHE/DFE.

Infection prevention and control

The academy's risk assessment will be reviewed including changes to start times and entry/ exit routes. The risk assessment will continue to be adhered to.

Cleaning

Appropriate focused or deep cleaning of the academy or areas of the academy will be considered in light of the situation.

Deployment of staff

Depending on the nature of the incident staff may be deployed differently.

Use of Supply

Supply staff are to be used when there would be a long term absence such as maternity cover or regular short term absence to cover management time or PPA. Short term (1 – 2 days) supply staff will be asked to lateral Flow Test and wear a face mask at all times around school apart from when in the communal area where they can eat.

Food provision

We will provide meal options for all pupils who are attending school.

We will provide food parcels or vouchers to eligible (FSM) pupils who are not attending school.

The school catering team will work with our food providers to prepare meals or food parcels, for collection or delivery, to eligible children.

Wrap around care/ clubs

A bubble system for after school sports is in place. The clubs run on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday and the year group attending changes each half term.

Breakfast club runs every morning in the school hall. Children are sitting with siblings or with bubbles. The numbers have been limited to ensure social distancing.

After school stars operates on a Tuesday and Thursday. As with Breakfast club social distancing is adhered to and in a well ventilated room.

Depending on the nature of the closure and the availability of staffing Wrap Around Care will be offered in line with government guidelines.

A bubble system will be in place/ will be instigated for Wrap Around Care

The contingency framework- Local area

The contingency framework (Local Area) is designed to act as a containment measure where:

- There is locally extremely high prevalence of coronavirus.
- Local area schools and academies have restrictions

Restrictive measures, of the kind set out in the contingency framework, cannot be implemented by academies without the explicit agreement of the DfE/ PHE. This plan sets out how the school will operate if additional restrictions become necessary.

Where advised by the PHE/DfE, in line with the available evidence, the school will only allow the on-site attendance of vulnerable children and children of critical workers. The academy will only limit attendance if they are directed to do so by PHE/ DfE. If attendance is limited, remote learning will be delivered to pupils who remain at home, in line with the Pupil Remote Learning Policy.

Locally if the contingency framework is implemented, the school will only allow the following pupils to attend on-site provision:

- Vulnerable pupils
- Children of critical workers
 - however, attendance will not be mandatory and parents will not be penalised if their child does not attend.

Infection prevention and control

The academy's risk assessment will be reviewed including changes to start times and entry/ exit routes. The risk assessment will continue to be adhered to.

Cleaning

Appropriate focused or deep cleaning of the academy or areas of the academy will be considered in light of the situation.

Deployment of staff

Depending on the nature of the situation staff may be deployed differently or on a rota system.

Use of Supply

Due to the high prevalence of coronavirus supply will not be used because of the high risk of transmission. Particularly in the bubble that has become infected.

If staffing becomes an issue the academy will work with Public Health, DfE and LA to see if alternatives can be offered.

Food provision

We will provide meal options for all pupils who are attending school.

We will provide food parcels or vouchers to eligible (FSM) pupils who are not attending school.

The school catering team will work with our food providers to prepare meals or food parcels, for collection or delivery, to eligible children.

Wrap around care/ clubs

Due to the high prevalence locally and restricted pupil numbers Wrap Around Care will not be offered

Depending on the nature of the closure and the availability of staffing Wrap Around Care will be offered in line with government guidelines. And a bubble system will be in place for Wrap Around Care

The contingency framework- Local academy level and Local Area

Transport

Pupils that have to attend school will be encouraged to walk or cycle wherever possible and to avoid public transport. If pupils and staff need to use public transport, they will be reminded that those over the age of 11 are required to wear a face covering while travelling; it is also advised that they wear face coverings on dedicated school transport (NB the suspension of school transport may be a restriction that is put in place).

Returning to school

The principal will work with the LA/PHE to ensure pupils only return to school when it is safe for them to do so. Prior to the return of more pupils and staff, all relevant risk assessments will be reviewed.

After a period of self-isolation, or the relaxation of restrictions, the principal will inform parents when their child will return to school.

The principal will listen to all concerns that parents may have about their child returning to school and will advise them of the measures in place to ensure the safety of their child.

Safeguarding

Ensuring safeguarding arrangements remain effective while the school is partially closed is a key priority.

Our Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy was updated and included an addendum to include provisions for keeping pupils safe during the coronavirus pandemic, both at home and in school – we will continue to follow these procedures for pupils who remain at home, where appropriate, until all pupils are able to return to school.

We will continue to ensure that:

- A DSL or deputy DSL is always available.

Health and Safety

The Health and Safety policy will be followed including the continuation of routine compliance checks- although these may be done at different times of day to avoid/ reduce risk of transmission. Health and Safety will be considered in lines with government advice following any reopening e.g. Legionella testing

Communication

The school will communicate its plan for addressing any imposed restrictions with parents, including in relation to:

- Opening arrangements.

- Access for specific targeted groups where applicable, such as certain year groups, vulnerable pupils and children of critical workers.
- Any reviews of the school's protective measures as part of our risk assessments.
- The arrangements for remote working.

All relevant stakeholders will be kept up-to-date with the circumstances of any imposed restrictions and how these affect the school as the situation develops.

If any member of the school community wishes to discuss any concerns relating to the school's provision during this period, they should contact the following as appropriate:

- Staff – their line manager
- Pupils – their class teacher or member of pastoral staff through Dojo
- Parents – the child's class teacher initially through dojo, school comms or email.

Monitoring and review

This plan will be reviewed continually in line with guidance from the government and Public Health England (PHE).

Any changes to the plan will be communicated to all relevant stakeholders.
